STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Appropriating Money to Aid in the Screening of the Outlet of Long Pond, in West College Grant, in Piscataquis County, north of Elliottsville Plantation.

Resolved: That the sum of two hundred and fifty 2 (\$250.00) dollars be and hereby is appropriated, to be 3 taken from the appropriation for the maintenance of the 4 department of inland fisheries and game, to be expended 5 by the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, to aid 6 in screening the outlet of Long Pond, in West College 7 grant, in Piscataquis county, north of Elliottsville Planta-8 tion. Provided, however, that said appropriation for the

9 erection of said screen shall not be available until some To responsible corporation or incorporated fish and game club, II or the town in which said outlet is located, or some other 12 town in the county of Piscataquis, in which said waters are 13 situated, shall have in legal town meeting, and having an 14 article in the warrant for said town meeting for that pur-15 pose, by vote of record, voted to assume all liability for 16 the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, 17 leaves and all debris so that the same will not become 18 clogged and prevent the free running of water through 19 the same. And provided, further, that said appropriation 20 shall not be available until the citizens of the county in 21 which said pond is situated shall have paid into the state 22 treasury the balance found necessary by the commissioner 23 of inland fisheries and game to erect said screen. And 24 provided, further, that if the actual cost of said screen 25 provided for in this resolve is less than the amount ap-26 propriated therefor, the state shall be liable for only one-27 half of the cost of such screen. Any part of said appro-28 priation not expended in the year nineteen hundred and 29 twenty-nine shall be available during the year nineteen hun-30 dred and thirty.
