## STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Poultry Husbandry.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of twenty thousand dollars for the year from July 3 first, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine to June thirtieth, 4 nineteen hundred and thirty and five thousand dollars for 5 the year from July first, nineteen hundred thirty to June 6 thirtieth, nineteen hundred thirty-one, for the erection and 7 maintenance including all expenses necessary and incidental 8 to the operation thereof, of a poultry plant suitable for the 9 study and observation of egg laying qualities and produc-10 tivity of various flocks, types and breeds of poultry, pro-11 vided that all birds entered in said contest shall be bred, HOUSE-No. 797

12 raised and owned by the entrant and shall also be truly 13 representative in color, size, shape and symmetry of the 14 breed each represents. Such plant and equipment to be 15 located upon land owned by the state of Maine in the town 16 of Monmouth, known as Highmoor Farm. Said sum to 17 be expended and said plant and equipment to be supervised 18 by and under the direction of the commissioner of agricul-19 ture or his agent in charge of animal industry. The said 20 commissioner or his agent shall have authority to sell and 21 dispose of all eggs produced in the progress of any tests 22 or trials carried on in connection therewith and all proceeds 23 of such sales of eggs shall be paid by him to the treasurer 24 of state and credited to the current appropriation for the 25 purposes specified in this resolve. The commissioner of 26 agriculture or his agent may employ a foreman, or super-27 intendent in charge of said poultry plant and such assistants 28 as may be necessary, provided, however, that such foreman, 29 superintendent or assistants shall be persons acceptable to 30 and approved by a majority of the executive committee of 31 the Maine Poultry Breeders Association, an organization 32 regularly incorporated under the laws of the state. Any 33 balance of the sum above appropriated for the fiscal year 34 ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred thirty, which may 35 remain unexpended at the end of said period shall be avail-36 able for expenditure during the fiscal year ending June 37 thirtieth, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.
