House Amendment "A" to Senate Paper 178, entitled: "AN  
ACT to Incorporate Fish River Power and Storage Com-  
pany."

---

Amend section fifteen by adding at the end thereof the  
2 following:

(c) Unless the International Paper and Power Company  
2 and its subsidiary, the American Realty Company, shall open  
3 for settlement their lands in Aroostook county to prospec-  
4 tive purchasers who desire to develop the same for agricul-  
5 tural purposes, and the sale of such lands shall be at a price  
6 which is reasonable and fair. In case that a dispute shall  
7 arise between the International Paper and Power Company  
8 or the American Realty Company, on the one hand and

9 such prospective purchasers on the other as to the location  
 10 of such lands to be so purchased and used, the number of  
 11 acres thereof desired to be purchased, or as to the purchase  
 12 price thereof, either party may appeal to a commission to  
 13 be composed of the secretary of state, the forest commis-  
 14 sioner and the chairman of the board of state assessors,  
 15 who, thereupon shall make an examination of the location  
 16 so desired to be purchased, or of any other matters upon  
 17 which such appeal has been taken, and shall make their deci-  
 18 sion and orders thereon and shall file the same in the office  
 19 of the secretary of state and such decision shall be binding  
 20 upon the International Paper and Power Company or the  
 21 American Realty Company and the supreme court sitting in  
 22 equity shall have authority to enforce the compliance with  
 23 such orders.
