IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relative to Lien on Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section fifty-six of chapter ninety-six of the revised statutes as amended by chapter one hundred and seventy-one of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-five is hereby further amended by striking out all of said section and substituting in place thereof the following:

'Sect. 56. *Lien on vehicles.* Whoever performs labor by himself or his employees in manufacturing, or repairing the ironwork or woodwork of wagons, carts, sleighs and other vehicles or so performing labor furnishes materials therefor or provides storage therefor, by direction or con-

6 sent of the owner thereof, shall have a lien on such vehicle
7 for his reasonable charges for said labor and for materials
8 used in performing said labor, and for said storage, which
9 takes precedence of all other claims and incumbrances on
10 said vehicles, not made to secure a similar lien, and may
11 be enforced by attachment at any time within ninety days
12 after such labor is performed or such materials or storage
13 furnished and not afterwards, provided, that a claim for
14 such lien is duly filed as required in the following section;
15 said lien, however, shall be dissolved if said property has
16 actually changed ownership prior to such filing.'
