## STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Provide for the Appointment of a Commission to Recommend Changes in the Sunday Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. The governor with the advice and consent of
2 the council shall appoint five citizens of the state represent3 ing the business and religious interests thereof as a com4 mission to be known as the commission on revision of the
5 Sunday laws. Said commissioners shall serve without pay
6 but shall be reimbursed for their actual expenses incurred
7 while engaged on the duties of said commission. They shall
8 meet as soon as convenient after their appointment at such

9 place as they may select and shall choose one of their num-10 ber to be chairman of the commission. Said commission 11 shall consider the advisability of legislation repealing or 12 amending the Sunday law of the state and especially the 13 advisability of legislation permitting amateur games and 14 sports on Sunday. The commission shall hold such hear-15 ings as it may deem necessary.

Sect. 2. Said commission shall on or before January first, 2 nineteen hundred and thirty-one, make a written report to 3 the governor and council, which report shall be transmitted 4 to the clerk of the house of representatives upon the organ-5 ization of the eighty-fifth legislature.

Sect. 3. The sum of two thousand dollars is hereby appro-2 priated for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of 3 this act.
