IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Sale of Milk, Cream, Jars and  
Bottles.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twenty-two of chapter thirty-seven of the revised  
2 statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by strik-  
3 ing out in the sixth and seventh lines thereof the words:  
4 "purchased after the third day of July, nineteen hundred  
5 and twenty-seven," so that said section as amended shall  
6 read as follows:

'Any manufacturer who sells milk or cream bottles to  
2 be used in this state that do not comply as to size and  
3 markings with the provisions of the two preceding sections,

4 shall forfeit five hundred dollars, to be recovered by the  
5 attorney-general in an action upon the bond of such man-  
6 ufacturer. Any dealer who uses for the purpose of selling  
7 milk or cream jars or bottles that do not comply with the  
8 requirements of section twenty of this chapter as to mark-  
9 ings and capacity shall be deemed guilty of using false or  
10 insufficient measures and punished by a fine not to exceed  
11 fifty dollars for each offense.'
