STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Appointment of Trustees of Normal
Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section one hundred forty-four of chapter six-
2 teen of the revised statutes is amended by striking out in
3 the third and fourth lines thereof, the words: "and not more
4 than two shall be of the same political party," so that said
5 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 144. Said schools shall be under the direction of a
2 board of five trustees, four of whom shall be appointed by
3 the governor with the advice and consent of the council,

4 for terms of four years. The state superintendent of pub-
5 lic schools is, by virtue of his office, a member of the said
6 board of normal school trustees. Said board shall have
7 charge of the general interests of said schools; shall see that
8 the affairs thereof are conducted as required by law and by
9 such by-laws as the board adopt; employ teachers and lec-
10 turers for the same; and, annually, on the first day of De-
11 cember lay before the governor and council, for the infor-
12 mation of the legislature, a financial statement, furnishing
13 an accurate detailed account of the receipts and expendi-
14 tures for the school year preceding.'
