AN ACT Amendatory of and Additional to Chapter Forty-five of the Revised Statutes, as Amended, Relating to Lobster Industry.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Revised statutes, chapter forty-five, section nineteen, as 2 amended by section nineteen, chapter ninety-eight, public 3 laws of nineteen hundred twenty-one, is amended by strik- 4 ing out the words: "No person whose license has been re- 5 voked or suspended shall be employed by another or assist 6 in the lobster business in any way," so that said section shall 7 read as follows :

'If any person, firm, or corporation to whom such license

2 shall be granted shall be incapacitated for any reason, ex-  
3 cept for the violation of the laws of the state relating to  
4 the lobster industry from using said license, said person,  
5 firm or corporation may permit his agent or employee, if  
6 a citizen of this state, to perform such duties under the  
7 license as may be necessary during the period of his or its  
8 incapacity; provided that said agent or employee shall, when  
9 performing said duties so licensed, exhibit upon demand  
10 of any authorized person, the certificate issued to his su-  
11 perior, as provided in the preceding section. Every person  
12 who shall violate the provisions of this section shall upon  
13 conviction be subject to the fines and penalties provided in  
14 section seventeen.'
