#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Amend Section Seventy-one of Chapter Eight of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter One Hundred and Thirty-six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Sixteen, Relative to the Salary of the Forest Commissioner.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section seventy-one of chapter eight of the revised stat-2 utes, as amended by chapter one hundred and thirty-six 3 of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen, is 4 hereby amended by striking out the word "two" in the

. 5 sixth line thereof, and substituting the word 'three,' so that

6 said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 71. All expenses incurred under the provisions of 2 sections sixty to seventy-three, both inclusive, shall be paid 3 from the funds raised and created by the tax assessed un-4 der the provisions of section sixty-one. For such services 5 the said deputy forest commissioner shall receive annually 6 the sum of seven hundred dollars, to be paid from the 7 funds provided under this act, in addition to the salary now 8 provided for the clerk to the land agent. It is also hereby 9 further provided that the forest commissioner shall receive 10 from the funds provided under this act, the sum of three 11 thousand dollars per year in addition to the salary as now 12 provided by law.'
