IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians  
for the General Care, Maintenance and Education Thereof.

---

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated  
2 from the state treasury to be expended under the direction  
3 of the governor and council, by the agent of the Passa-  
4 maquoddy Tribe of Indians, for the benefit of said tribe for  
5 the year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine  
6 to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and thirty, and for the  
7 year from July first, nineteen hundred and thirty to June  
8 thirtieth, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, as follows:

Amounting to twenty-six thousand dollars for the year  
2 from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine to June

3 thirtieth, nineteen hundred and thirty; and twenty-six thou-  
4 sand dollars, for the year from July first, nineteen hundred  
5 and thirty to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and thirty-  
6 one.

And be it further resolved, that any balance of any of the  
2 sub-divisions above named and not required for the pur-  
3 pose may, upon recommendation of the state auditor, be  
4 transferred by the governor and council to pay bills against  
5 any of the above sub-divisions where bills may have been  
6 contracted in excess of the amount above set forth.
