IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Making It Unlawful to Fish for Smelts in Certain Parts of Washington and Hancock Counties.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section I. No smelts shall be taken or fished for in the
2 tidal waters of the towns of Addison, Columbia Falls, Har3 rington, Cherryfield, Milbridge and Steuben, all in the coun4 ty of Washington, and so much of the tidal waters in the
5 town of Gouldsboro and in the Plantation No. Seven in the
6 county of Hancock bordering on Steuben harbor, except
7 by hook and line from April first to October first of each
8 year; except smelts may be taken from April first to May

9 first of each year by hook and line, gill nets, and hand dip 10 nets.

Sect. 2. It shall be lawful to sell and to offer for sale 2 within this state and to transport outside the state all smelts 3 legally caught within said tidal waters.

Sect. 3. Any person violating any provision of this act 2 shall be punished by a fine of one hundred dollars for each 3 offense.
