IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Set Off Certain Land from the Town of Glenburn
to be Annexed to the City of Old Town.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. All that part of the town of Glenburn in
2 Penobscot county which is situated eastward of a line drawn
3 through the center of Pushaw lake, said line being more
4 particularly described as follows: Beginning at a point in
5 the east and west town line dividing the town of Glenburn
6 and Hudson midway between the easterly and westerly
7 shores of said lake, thence generally southeastward keeping
8 midway between said shores until the west line of Old Town
9 is intersected, and for the purpose of this description, the

10 Twin Islands, so-called, are considered as forming a part
11 of the easterly shore of said lake, together with the inhabi-
12 tants thereof, is hereby set off from the town of Glenburn
13 and annexed to the city of Old Town, and said city of Old
14 Town is hereby vested with all powers and privileges and
15 subject to all the duties and obligations attending the an-
16 nexation of the above described land.

Sect. 2. The several inhabitants and all resident and non-
2 resident owners of the land hereinabove described shall be
3 holden to pay all taxes which have been legally assessed
4 upon them by the town of Glenburn for the year nineteen
5 hundred and twenty-eight, the collector of taxes for the
6 town of Glenburn is hereby authorized and required to col-
7 lect and pay all taxes to him committed for the year nine-
8 teen hundred twenty-eight according to his respective war-
9 rants. This act so far as it relates to the setting off of the
10 above described land shall not take effect unless accepted
11 and approved by a majority vote of the legal voters within
12 said town of Glenburn at the annual town meeting to be
13 called for the municipal year nineteen hundred twenty-nine
14 to thirty. The town clerk shall reduce the subject of this
15 act to the following question: "Shall the Act to set off the
16 following described land situate in the Town of Glenburn,
17 to the city of Old Town, to wit, all that part of the town of
18 Glenburn in Penobscot county which is situated eastward
19 of a line drawn through the center of Pushaw lake, said
20 line being more particularly described as follows: Beginning

21 at a point in the east and west town line dividing the town
22 of Glenburn and Hudson midway between the easterly and
23 westerly shores of said lake, thence generally southeastward
24 keeping midway between said shores until the west line of
25 Old Town is intersected, and for the purpose of this de-
26 scription, the Twin Islands, so-called, are considered as
27 forming a part of the easterly shore of said lake, be ac-
28 cepted?" And the voters shall indicate by an X placed
29 against the words "Yes" or "No." The result shall be de-
30 clared by the selectmen and due certificate thereof filed by
31 the town clerk with the secretary of state.

Sect. 3. Whereas for the purpose of obtaining popular
2 approval of this act by the legally qualified voters of the
3 town of Glenburn at the annual town meeting of the inhabi-
4 tants of the said town of Glenburn to be holden the eleventh
5 day of March, A. D. nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

Whereas, for the purpose of enabling the assessors of the
2 city of Old Town to effect their assessment as of April one,
3 nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, in the event that this act
4 is approved by the legally qualified voters of the town of
5 Glenburn, and

Whereas, in the opinion of the legislature, these facts rend-
2 er the immediate passage of this act necessary for the proper
3 performance of local municipal duties relative to the setting
4 off of the said land, by the town of Glenburn and the an-
5 nexation of the said land by the city of Old Town and
6 constitutes an emergency within the meaning of the con-

7 stitution, now therefor,

Sect. 4. In view of the emergency recited in section three
2 hereof, this act shall take effect when approved.
