IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Repeal the Organization of the Plantation of
Long Pond.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Organization of plantation of Long Pond re-
2 pealed; corporate existence to continue for certain pur-
3 poses. The organization of the plantation of Long Pond,
4 January twenty-second, nineteen hundred and twelve, is
5 hereby repealed; provided, however, that the corporate ex-
6 istence, powers, duties and liabilities of said plantation shall
7 survive for the purpose of prosecuting and defending all
8 pending suits and causes of suits to which said plantation

9 is or may be a party, and all needful processes growing out
10 of the same, and for the further purpose of providing for
11 the payment of all or any judgments, which may be ren-
12 dered against said plantation and to pay state, county and
13 forestry district taxes assessed for the years nineteen hun-
14 dred and twenty-nine and nineteen hundred and thirty.

Sect. 2. Unexpended school funds, how disposed of. All
2 funds unexpended for school purposes at the time when
3 this act is effective out of amounts raised by said plantation
4 for school purposes or out of amounts paid by the state for
5 school purposes, shall be paid by the treasurer of said plan-
6 tation or such other person in whose custody such funds
7 may be, to the treasurer of state. Such amounts, so re-
8 ceived, shall constitute a fund for school purposes of which
9 the income only shall be expended and applied for the school-
10 ing of children resident within the limits of the present
11 plantation.

Sect. 3. Act effective March 1, 1929. This act shall take
2 effect and be in force from and after the first day of March
3 in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.
