STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Alberta Wadsworth of Belfast.

Resolved: That a pension of twelve dollars per month be,
2 and hereby is, granted to Alberta Wadsworth, of Belfast,
3 to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers
4 and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first,
5 nineteen hundred and twenty-nine and continue until other-
6 wise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Alberta Wadsworth is the daughter of the late Captain Ansel Wadsworth, an honorably discharged veteran of the Civil War. Captain Wadsworth was a good soldier and his health was broken in the service. The daughter taught in the public schools of the state for a long time; she is now disabled because of a broken hip and is in very straightened financial circumstances. Her brother upon whom she depended largely for support died a few months ago. She always lived with her father and mother and took care of them until they died.
