STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Amend Section Two of Chapter Thirty-four of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Eighty-one of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Twenty-one, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred One of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Twenty-three, Relative to the Duties of the Commissioner of Agriculture.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section two of chapter thirty-four of the revised statutes,
2 as amended by chapter eighty-one of the public laws of
3 nineteen hundred twenty-one, as amended by chapter two
4 hundred one of the public laws of nineteen hundred twenty5 three, is hereby further amended by striking out the whole

6 of said section and by substituting in place thereof the fol-7 lowing:

'Sect. 2. Duties. The commissioner of agriculture is the 2 chief executive charged with the enforcement of chapters 3 thirty-four to thirty-eight inclusive, and shall be vigilant 4 in discovering violations thereof and making complaint to 5 the proper authorities. He shall by personal observation, 6 investigation and correspondence, acquaint himself with the 7 methods and wants of practical husbandry, the means of 8 fertilization, and the adaption of various products to the o soils and climate of the state; also, with the progress of 10 scientific and practical agriculture elsewhere, with a view 11 to the more complete development of the natural resources 12 of the state. He shall gather statistics of information con-13 cerning agriculture and publish the same annually; he shall 14 assist the farmers of the state, in so far as is practicable, 15 to secure farm help and to promote increased production 16 of farm crops through the selection, the growing and the 17 dissemination of superior strains of seeds. He shall make 18 and preserve a full record of all rules and regulations pro-19 mulgated under the provisions of this chapter, and all pay-20 ments and expenses incurred hereunder, and all other trans-21 actions performed by him in the discharge of his duties, as 22 herein provided. He may investigate and furnish state-23 ments to shippers and other interested parties as to the 24 quality and condition of fruits, vegetables, dairy and other 25 perishable farm products when received within the state for 26 intrastate or interstate commerce, under such rules and reg-27 ulations as he may prescribe, including payment of such 28 fees as will be reasonable and as nearly as may be to cover 29 the cost for the service rendered. Statements so issued by 30 the authorized agents of the department shall be received in 31 all courts of the State of Maine as prima facie evidence of 32 the truth of the statements therein contained. He may em-33 ploy such agents and assistants and make such purchases 34 as may be necessary in the proper performance of his du-35 ties.'
