STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Provide that the Governor and Council Shall Fix
the Salary of the Secretary of the Department of Public
Welfare.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section two of chapter one hundred forty-seven of the
2 revised statutes, as amended by section one of chapter
3 eighty of the public laws of nineteen hundred seventeen, is
4 hereby amended by striking out the words "not exceeding
5 twenty-five hundred dollars" in the ninth and tenth lines
6 thereof, so that said section as amended shall read as fol-
7 lows:

'Sect. 2. The board shall appoint a secretary, not of
2 their own number, who shall have been a resident of the
3 state for at least five years, and shall be qualified by special
4 knowledge and experience in charitable, correctional and
5 institutional work; he shall receive for his services, in ad-
6 dition to his traveling and other necessary expenses, such
7 salary as may be agreed upon by the board, with the ap-
8 proval of the governor and council. The accounts of such
9 secretary for his traveling and other necessary expenses
10 shall be approved by the board, audited by the state audi-
11 tor and, together with the salary of such secretary, shall
12 be paid out of the state treasury upon certificate of the state
13 auditor.'
