STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

---

AN ACT Relating to Motor Vehicle Laws.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section ninety-three of chapter two hundred eleven of the  
2 public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, as amend-  
3 ed by chapter ninety-eight of the public laws of nineteen  
4 hundred and twenty-five, is hereby further amended by  
5 striking out the whole of the last sentence and inserting in  
6 place thereof the following: 'All fines and forfeitures, in-  
7 cluding all cash and other bail, collected under this act shall  
8 be paid (1) to the commission and applied as provided in  
9 section ninety-two hereof, together with any part of the  
10 costs taxed by the court for a state highway police or in-

11 spector, when the original complaint and arrest are made  
12 by such police, or inspector, but (2) into the treasury of  
13 the county where the offense is prosecuted, when either the  
14 original complaint or arrest are made by any other officer,'  
15 so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 93. Municipal and police courts and trial justices  
2 in their respective counties shall have concurrent jurisdic-  
3 tion with the supreme judicial and superior courts over all  
4 prosecutions for all violations of the provisions of this act.  
5 All fines and forfeitures, including all cash and other bail,  
6 collected under this act shall be paid (1) to the commis-  
7 sion and applied as provided in section ninety-two hereof,  
8 together with any part of the costs taxed by the court for  
9 a state highway police or inspector, when the original com-  
10 plaint and arrest are made by such police, or inspector, but  
11 (2) into the treasury of the county where the offense is  
12 prosecuted, when either the original complaint or arrest are  
13 made by any other officer.'
