STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relative to the Crime of Arson and Punishment.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Destruction of dwellings or lives by fire. Who-

- 2 ever wilfully and maliciously sets fire to, or aids, instigates,
- 3 incites, promotes or procures the burning of, any dwelling
- 4 house, or any building occupied in part for dwelling or
- 5 lodging purposes, and owned wholly or partly by himself
- 6 or another; or any kitchen, shop, barn, stable, garage, shed,
- 7 or other buildings adjoining thereto, owned wholly or partly
- 8 by himself or another, shall be punished by imprisonment
- 9 for not less than two nor more than twenty years; and who-
- 10 ever destroys the life of any human being in consequence

11 of such burning, shall be guilty of murder and punished 12 accordingly.

Sect. 2. Destruction of buildings other than dwellings.

2 Whoever wilfully and maliciously sets fire to, or aids, insti
3 gates, incites, promotes or procures the burning of, any

4 barn, stable, garage, shed or other building, not parcel of

5 a dwelling house and owned by himself or another; or any

6 office, shop, storehouse, warehouse, factory, mill, power

7 house or other building owned by himself or another; or

8 any meeting house, court house, schoolhouse, town house,

9 work house, prison, jail, academy, college hall, public build
10 ing, monument or memorial; or any vessel, dock, bridge,

11 lock, dam or flume of another, shall be imprisoned for not

12 less than one nor more than ten years.

Sect. 3. Destruction of property other than buildings.

2 Whoever wilfully and maliciously sets fire to, or aids, in
3 stigates, incites, promotes or procures the burning of, any

4 hay, grain, wheat, corn, oats, barley, rye or vegetable prod
5 uct, either growing, stacked in the field, or stored; or any

6 tank of oil, gasoline, pile of coal, wood or other fuel; or

7 any pile of planks, boards, posts, rails, lumber or standing

8 trees or underwood; or any street car, railway car, ship,

9 boat or other water craft, automobile or other motor ve
10 hicle; or any stocks, bonds or muniments of title; or any

11 personal property of the value of twenty-five dollars owned

12 by another person and not specifically named herein, shall

13 be imprisoned for not less than one nor more than three 14 years.

Sect. 4. Burning to defraud the insurer. Whoever wil2 fully, with intent to defraud the insurer, sets fire to or aids,
3 instigates, incites, promotes or procures the burning of, any
4 building, motor vehicle, merchandise, household furniture,
5 chattels, stocks, bonds, muniments of title, or personal prop6 erty of any kind, owned by himself or another and insured
7 by any person or corporation against loss or damage by
8 fire, shall be imprisoned for not less than one nor more
9 than five years.

Sect. 5. Attempts to commit arson. Whoever wilfully 2 and maliciously attempts to set fire to, or attempts to aid, 3 instigate, incite, promote or procure the burning of any of 4 the buildings or properties, mentioned as subject of arson 5 in sections one, two, three and four of this act, shall be 6 punished by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars, 7 or by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than 8 two years.

The placing or distributing of any inflammable, explosive 2 or combustible material or substance, or any device in any 3 building or property mentioned in the foregoing sections in 4 an arrangement or preparation with intent to eventually 5 wilfully and maliciously set fire to or burn same, or to pro-6 cure the setting fire to or burning of same, shall, for the 7 purposes of this act constitute an attempt to burn such 8 building or property.

Sect. 6. Repealing clause. Sections one, two, three and 2 four of chapter one hundred twenty-one and section twenty-3 two of chapter one hundred twenty-eight, revised statutes 4 of nineteen hundred sixteen, are hereby repealed.

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
