STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relative to the Granting of Licenses in Sea and Shore Fisheries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. No person shall be allowed to sell any such
2 fish as are now or hereafter may be within the supervision,
3 control or jurisdiction of the director of sea and shore fish4 eries or to catch any such fish, except for the use of him5 self or family, unless duly licensed therefor by said director
6 as hereinafter provided.

Sect. 2. Said director shall issue a license to any person, 2 except as herein provided, who makes written application 3 therefor, such application to be made on blanks furnished 4 by said director, but no such license shall be issued unless 5 all questions asked or information called for by said appli-6 cation shall have been completed to the satisfaction of said 7 director.

Sect. 3. No such license shall be issued to any person 2 who has not, for a period of ten years prior to the date 3 of application therefor, been a resident of the state of 4 Maine, except that any person who has heretofore been a 5 resident of this state but for a time resident elsewhere, and 6 returns to the state of Maine for the purpose of establish-7 ing and maintaining a bona fide residence therein may, if 8 otherwise entitled, receive such license, in which case such 9 non-residence may be taken as a part of said ten years.

Sect. 4. All such licenses shall expire annually on the 2 thirtieth day of June and the fee for same or any renewal 3 thereof shall be one dollar.

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
