STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Continuous Roads Through Three or
More Towns.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter one hundred and thirty-nine of the public laws of
2 nineteen hundred and twenty-seven relating to continuous
3 roads through three or more towns is hereby amended by
4 adding to section seven the following:

‘Provided, however, that no new state-aid locations shall
2 receive the benefits contemplated in this section until such
3 a time as the locations designated prior to the passage of
4 this act have been built.’

So that said section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 7. *Special provision for towns where it is impos-*

2 *sible to form an association of towns.* Any town or towns
3 which are so located with reference to the state boundary
4 or to adjoining towns that it is impossible to form an asso-
5 ciation of towns as contemplated in this act for the build-
6 ing of state aid highways may apply for and receive the
7 benefits of this act for the building of a state aid highway
8 on any location extending across said town or towns. Pro-
9 vided, however, that no new state-aid locations shall receive
10 the benefits contemplated in this section until such a time
11 as the locations designated prior to the passage of this act
12 have been built.'
