IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Making It Unlawful to Solicit Rides in Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person while within the limits

of any way in this state to stop, impede, hinder or delay the

progress of any private motor vehicle for the purpose of

or while soliciting a ride from the operator of any such

private motor vehicle.
