STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Annual Payments to the Aroostook
Law Library.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eight of chapter thirteen of the revised statutes,
2 as amended by chapter thirty of the public laws of nineteen
3 hundred and twenty-one, is hereby further amended by
4 striking out the words "county of Lincoln" in the second
5 line and inserting in place thereof the words 'counties of
6 Aroostook and Lincoln' and by striking out the word "five,"
7 in the eighth line of said chapter thirty, public laws of
8 nineteen hundred and twenty-one, and inserting in place
9 thereof the word 'eight,' so that said section as amended
10 shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 8. The treasurer of each county, except the counties
2 of Aroostook and Lincoln, shall annually pay to the treas-
3 urer of the law library association of his county, for the
4 uses and benefits of the county law library, the sum of
5 five hundred dollars. The treasurer of the county of Lin-
6 coln shall annually pay to the treasurer of the law library
7 association of his county the sum of two hundred and fifty
8 dollars. The treasurer of Aroostook county shall pay
9 annually to the law library association of his county the
10 sum of eight hundred dollars, in addition to the five hun-
11 dred dollars above mentioned, and at least five hundred
12 dollars shall be expended annually by the library association
13 of said county for books for the library at the court house
14 at Caribou in said county. The treasurer of each county
15 shall also pay to the treasurer of the law library association
16 of his county all money received from persons admitted as
17 attorneys in the supreme judicial court upon motion, with-
18 out a certificate from the board of examiners of applicants
19 for admission to the bar.’
