IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians for the General Care, Maintenance and Education Thereof.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from 2 the state treasury to be expended under the direction of the 3 governor and council, by the agent of the Passamaquoddy 4 tribe of Indians, for the benefit of said tribe for the year 5 from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine to June 6 thirtieth, nineteen hundred and thirty, and for the year 7 from July first, nineteen hundred and thirty to June thir-

8 tieth, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, as follows:
