STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Establishing a Feeding Station or Rearing Pools for Fish at, or Near, Houlton, in the County of Aroostook.

Resolved: That the sum of two thousand dollars be, and 2 hereby is, appropriated, out of the general fund for the 3 maintenance and work of the department of inland fisheries 4 and game, for the purpose of aiding in establishing a feed- 5 ing station for fish at a suitable point at, or near, Houlton, 6 Aroostook county, said money hereby appropriated to be 7 expended under the direction of the commissioner of inland 8 fisheries and game.

Provided, however, that this appropriation shall not be
2 available unless a free deed of the land upon which said
3 proposed station is to be erected is given to the state; pro-
4 vided, further, that this appropriation shall not be available
5 until the balance necessary to install said station, as deter-
6 mined by the commissioner of inland fisheries and game,
7 shall have been contributed by interested citizens and paid
8 to the state treasurer, to be added to the amount appropri-
9 ated herein; provided, further, that this appropriation shall
10 not be available until such time as the commissioner of in-
11 land fisheries and game, after careful investigation of exist-
12 ing conditions, has found a location at or near Houlton
13 which will afford the proper temperature and supply of
14 water and other conditions necessary for the successful
15 operation of a feeding station for trout and salmon; pro-
16 vided, further, that this appropriation, or any part thereof,
17 if not expended during the year nineteen hundred and
18 twenty-nine, shall be available during the year nineteen hun-
19 dred and thirty.
