STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Give Municipal Courts Jurisdiction of Certain
Offenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The offenses of assault; assault and battery; and larceny, when the alleged value of the things taken does not exceed one hundred dollars; shall, when such offenses are not of a high and aggravated nature, constitute misdemeanors; and Municipal Courts shall have jurisdiction to punish such offenses by fine not exceeding one hundred dollars or by imprisonment in the County Jail not exceeding six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sect. 2. All acts or parts of acts, either of the general laws or private and special laws, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
