STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Section One Hundred Eighteen, Chapter Twenty-nine of the Revised Statutes of Nineteen Hundred and Thirty.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one hundred eighteen, chapter twenty-nine of the Revised Statutes of nineteen hundred and thirty is hereby amended by striking out the second sentence and inserting in lieu thereof the following: 'All fines and forfeitures collected under this chapter shall be paid (I) one-half to the Commission and applied as provided in section one hundred seventeen, (2) one-half into the Treasurer of the county where the offense is prosecuted,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 118. Court jurisdiction of violations; transmission of fines. 1921, c. 211, Par. 93, 1925 c. 98. Municipal and police courts and trial justices in their respective counties shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the Superior Court over all prosecutions for all violations of the provisions of this chapter. All fines and forfeitures collected under this chapter shall be paid (1) one-half to the commission and applied as provided in section one hundred seventeen, (2) one-half into the treasury of the county where the offense is prosecuted.'
