AN ACT Relative to Ice Fishing for Pickerel.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twenty-one of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the nineteenth paragraph thereof and inserting in place thereof the following:

‘During the months of November and December, pickerel may be taken through the ice in waters open to ice fishing for landlocked salmon, trout, togue, and white perch, with not more than five set lines to each person, when fishing through the ice in the daytime and when under the immediate personal supervision of the person fishing. The month of January shall be closed to all ice fishing for any kind of fish. During the open season for taking landlocked salmon, trout, togue, and white perch through the ice, pickerel may be taken through the ice with not more than five set lines to each family.’
