STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Establishing a Game Preserve on Gero Island, in
Chesuncook Plantation, County of Piscataquis.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Game preserve established on Gero Island, in Chesuncook Plantation, county of Piscataquis. No person shall at any time hunt, chase, catch, kill or destroy any wild bird or wild animal within the limits of the following described tract, or territory, situated in Piscataquis county, to wit: The whole of the island in the lake created by Ripogenus dam, known as Ripogenus, or Chesuncook, Lake, which island is known as Gero Island, and is situated wholly within the plantation of Chesuncook. It shall be unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time any wild bird, or wild animal, or part thereof, taken within the above described territory.

Sect. 2. Penalties for violations. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
