S T A T E O F M A I N E

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Fishing in Cold Stream, in Norridgewock.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Cold Stream, in the town of Norridgewock, which stream is a tributary to Oosoola stream, commonly called Mill Stream, in said town of Norridgewock.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
