STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Fishing in Roxbury Pond, in Roxbury
and Byron.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Roxbury Pond, located in the towns of Roxbury and Byron, in the county of Oxford, except by trolling, or fly fishing in the ordinary manner; provided, however, that plug fishing, so-called, from permanent wharf or shore shall be lawful during the open season provided by the general laws.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
