STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Pedestrians on the Highway.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Pedestrians to walk on left hand side of highway. Chapter one hundred forty of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding to said chapter a new section, to be numbered thirty-one C, to read as follows:

'Sect. 31C. Pedestrians to walk on left hand side of highway; penalty. It shall be unlawful for any pedestrian to walk along and upon any highway outside of a business or residential district otherwise than close to his left hand edge of the highway. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than ten dollars and costs.'
