AN ACT Relative to Closed Season on Deer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section sixty-one of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the first paragraph thereof and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sect. 61. Closed time on deer. There shall be an annual closed season on deer in all the counties of this state from December first of each year to October thirty-first of the following year, both days inclusive, except in game sanctuaries as established by law, where closed season is perpetual, during which said closed season, except as hereinafter provided, it shall be unlawful to hunt any deer or have in possession any part thereof; and no person shall during the open season above named, except as hereinafter provided, kill or have in possession, more than one deer or part thereof. A person lawfully killing a deer in open season shall have not more than five days in which to transport the same to his home and may have the same in possession at his home in closed season.'
