IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relative to Hunting Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty-one of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out, in lines three and four of sub-section six thereof, the following words: "but any resident under eighteen years of age may hunt without a license," and by inserting in place thereof the following: 'Any resident under the age of sixteen years may hunt without a license, provided he is accompanied by a parent or guardian at all times while in the fields or forests or on the waters or ice of the state with firearms in his possession,' so that said sub-section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'6. Hunting licenses shall not be issued to any non-resident under eighteen years of age unless the written consent of the parent or guardian is attached to the application. Any resident under the age of sixteen years may hunt without a license, provided he is accompanied by a parent or guardian at all times while in the fields or forests or on the waters or ice of the state with firearms in his possession.'
