STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend An Act to Incorporate the Pistol Stream
Dam Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section two of chapter three hundred seventy-eight of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one is hereby amended by striking out the word "second" in the second line of said section and inserting in the place thereof the word 'first'; also by striking out the word "four" in the third line of said section and inserting in the place thereof the word 'three'; also by striking out in the fifth line of said section the words "from said second lake"; also by striking out in the seventh line the word "second" and inserting in place thereof the word 'first', and also by striking out in the eighth and ninth lines of said section the words "including a dam at the outlet of the first Pistol lake in township three in said north division", so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 2. Said corporation may erect and maintain a dam on Pistol stream at the outlet of the first Pistol lake in township three, north division of Bingham's Penobscot Purchase, in Hancock county, to facilitate the driving of logs and other lumber down said stream, and may remove rocks, excavate ledges, build dams and side dams, and make other improve-

ments in said stream between said first lake and the mouth of said stream.'

Sect. 2. Section four of said chapter three hundred seventy-eight of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one is hereby amended by striking out the word "fifteen" in the third line of said section and inserting in the place thereof the word 'twenty-five'; also by striking out between the word "scale" in the fourth line and the word "and" in the eighth line of said section the words "for all logs and lumber that pass through the dam at the outlet of the second Pistol lake aforesaid, and ten cents per thousand feet on all logs and lumber landed below said second lake dam and which shall pass over the dam at the outlet of said lower Pistol lake", so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 4. Said corporation may demand and receive a toll for the passage of logs and lumber through and over said dams and improvements of twenty-five cents per thousand feet, board measure, woods scale, and said company shall have a lien upon all logs and lumber which shall pass over any of its said dams and improvements for the payment of said tolls, but the logs of each particular mark shall be holden only for the tolls on such mark; and unless such toll is paid within twenty days after such logs or lumber, or a major part thereof, arrive at the Passadunkeag boom, or the place of manufacture or destination, said corporation may seize said logs and lumber and sell such part thereof as shall be necessary to pay such tolls and the costs and charges of such seizure and sale. Notice of the time and place of such sale shall be given ten days before such sale in some newspaper printed in Bangor.'
