STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relative to Wearing of State Highway Police
Uniform.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one hundred twenty-four of chapter twenty-nine of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding the following: 'It shall be unlawful for any person to wear the prescribed uniform or badge of the state highway police or any distinctive part thereof except on order of the chief of said state highway police,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 124. Members of the state highway police shall be provided at the expense of the state with a distinctive uniform and badge, and with suitable equipment, including motorcycles for use when requisite to the performance of their official duties, all of which shall remain the property of the state. When on duty to enforce the laws of the road, and at such other times as the chief may require, state highway policemen shall be in uniform. They shall hold no other office during their term of service. It shall be unlawful for any person to wear the prescribed uniform or badge of the state highway police or any distinctive part thereof except on order of the chief of said state highway police.'
