STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Authorize the Appointment of An Assistant
County Attorney for Penobscot County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. R. S. c. 125, Sec. 38, relating to salaries of county attorneys further amended. Section thirty-eight of chapter one hundred twenty-five of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words "eighteen hundred dollars" in the thirteenth line thereof and inserting in place thereof the words 'three thousand dollars' so that the said thirteenth line as amended shall read as follows:

'Penobscot County increased: Penobscot three thousand dollars.'

Sect. 2. The county attorney of the county of Penobscot may, if he considers it necessary, appoint an assistant to be approved by a justice of the superior court resident in said county or by the chief justice of the supreme judicial court. Said assistant shall take the oath prescribed for county attorneys, and assist the county attorney in the ordinary duties of his office, in the drawing of indictments, in the hearing of complaints before the grand jury, and in the preparation and trial of criminal cases. He shall, when directed by the county attorney, act as counsel for the state in the trial of complaints

before judges of municipal and police courts and trial justices. The salary of the said assistant county attorney shall be paid by the county attorney. Such assistant county attorney shall hold his office during the pleasure of the county attorney.
