STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Identification of Criminals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty-seven of chapter one hundred forty-seven of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out in the first line of said section the word "felony" and substituting in place thereof the word 'crime', so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 47. Prisoners who have been convicted of crime and committed under sentence may, if deemed advisable, for the purpose of subsequent identification be measured and described in accordance with the Bertillon method for the identification of criminals, and their photographs and finger-prints taken.'
