STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Maine Delegation in Congress to Use Their Influence to Prohibit the Importation of Pulpwood from Soviet, Russia.

Resolved: That the Senators and Members of the House of Representatives in the National Congress from this state be, and hereby are requested to exert their influence to stop the importation of pulpwood from Soviet, Russia, and to ascertain whether or not such pulpwood imported is a product of prison labor, and take such other action for the protection of the pulpwood industry in the state of Maine, and that the secretary of state be directed to forward soon as may be one copy of this resolution to each Senator and Member of the House of Representatives in Congress from this state.
