STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Regulate Fishing in Wilson Lake in the Town of
Wilton in the County of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any trout, togue or salmon in Wilson Lake, so called, in the town of Wilton, in the county of Franklin, by plug fishing or bait fishing; except that plug fishing from a permanent wharf or shore shall be legal during the open season. It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time any trout, togue or salmon taken in violation of the provisions of these rules and regulations.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of these rules and regulations shall be subject to a penalty of not more than three hundred dollars and costs or be imprisoned for not exceeding ninety days, or both said fine and imprisonment.
