STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Fishing in East Machias Waters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

To amend section one of chapter three hundred and twenty of the special laws of eighteen hundred thirty-three by striking out all of said section and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

'Section 1. No person shall be allowed to take any salmon, shade or alewives in the waters of the East Machias river by means of a large net, seine, spear or scoop-net, between the fifteenth day of July in one year and the fifteenth day of May, in the following year, under a penalty of not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars for each offense.

'It shall be lawful for any person to catch and take any of the kinds of fish mentioned in this section in the ordinary manner of fishing, with a hook and line.

'All fines recovered under this section shall be paid to the treasurer of said town.'
