STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating Fishing in Dead River, South Branch, and Tributaries Thereto.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Regulating Fishing in Dead River, South Branch, and tributaries thereto. Dead River, South Branch, in the counties of Franklin and Oxford, is hereby opened to fishing during the open season provided by the general law, provided it shall be unlawful for any person at any time to take, catch, kill, or destroy in any one day more than fifteen fish in said Dead River, South Branch, or any trout less than seven inches in length; provided, further, that all tributaries to Dead River, South Branch, above Flagg Dam, so-called, in Dallas Plantation, county of Franklin, shall be closed to all fishing at all times.

Sect. 2. Penalty for violation. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
