STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating Fishing in Round Mountain Lake.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Fishing in Round Mountain Lake. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill, any kind of fish at any time, in Round Mountain Lake, in Alder stream township, in the county of Franklin, except it shall be lawful to fish in said lake in the ordinary way of casting with artificial flies or fly fishing, so-called, during the open season provided by the general law; provided, it shall be unlawful for any person to catch and kill more than five trout or salmon in all in any one day in said lake.

Sect. 2. Penalty for violation. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
