STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating Fishing in Bunganut Lake, Ossipee Lake,
Lone Pond, Moody Pond and Barker's Pond, County of
York.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time between the first day of October of each year and the first day of May of the following year, in the waters of Bunganut Lake, Ossipee Lake, Lone Pond, Moody Pond and Barker's Pond, all of which waters are located in the county of York.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time any kind of fish taken in violation of the provisions of this act.

Sect. 2. Provided, however, that Shaker Pond, sometimes known as Messabesic Pond, in Alfred, said county of York, be open to ice fishing for pickerel only, from the fifteenth day of December of each year to the fifteenth day of March of the following year, which period shall constitute the open season for ice fishing only, in York County.

Sect. 3. All existing laws and regulations conflicting with this act are hereby repealed.

Sect. 4. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to a penalty of not more than three hundred dollars and costs, or imprisonment for ninety days, or both said fine and imprisonment.
