STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Opening Upper and Lower Cold Stream Ponds to Ice Fishing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Upper and Lower Cold Stream Ponds opened to ice fishing. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any fish on or through the ice in Upper and Lower Cold Stream Ponds, in the towns of Enfield and Lowell, in the county of Penobscot, except that fishing through the ice shall be lawful on Thursday and Saturday of each week during the month of February.

Sect. 2. Penalty for violation. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
