STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Increase the Powers of the Portland High School
Athletic Field Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section three of chapter seventy-seven of the Private and Special Laws of 1929 is hereby amended by adding to said section the following:

'The said commission shall have power to borrow money and issue notes or other evidences of indebtedness, and to secure the payment thereof by pledge or assignment of any revenues derived from the leasing or letting of said land, facilities and equipment, or by mortgage or pledge of any of its property and assets; but said commission shall not have power to pledge the credit of the City of Portland.'

So that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 3. Powers. The said commission shall have power to lay out and construct, and to hold, manage, control, lease or let, for the purpose of high school and other athletics and other public events, an athletic field, together with bleachers, grand-stands, locker-houses and other like equipment; and to receive, hold in trust and expend for the laying out, construction, improvement and enlargement of such athletic field, bleachers, grand-stands, locker-houses and other like equipment, such gifts and contributions as may from time to time be made to it.

The said commission shall have power to borrow money and issue notes or other evidences of indebtedness, and to secure the payment thereof by pledge or assignment of any revenues derived from the leasing or letting of said land, facilities and equipment, or by mortgage or pledge of any of its property and assets; but said commission shall not have power to pledge the credit of the City of Portland.'
