STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Commitments to the Reformatory for Women.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section fifty-six of chapter one hundred fifty-two of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the word "years" in the second line thereof, the words 'and under the age of forty years', so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 56. The state shall maintain a reformatory in which all women over the age of sixteen years and under the age of forty years who have been convicted of or have pleaded guilty to crime in the courts of the state or of the United States, and who have been duly sentenced and removed thereto, shall be imprisoned in accordance with the sentence or orders of said courts and the rules and regulations of said reformatory.'
