STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT to Establish a Game Preserve in the Towns of Readfield and Winthrop in Kennebec County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. No person shall at any time hunt, chase, kill, destroy or catch any wild bird, wild animal or fish in or upon the waters of Carleton Pond, so called, in the towns of Readfield and Winthrop in the County of Kennebec, or within the lands of the Augusta Water District adjacent to said pond and located in said towns of Readfield and Winthrop, now owned or which may be hereafter acquired by said District in furtherance of its chartered purposes; provided, however, that the penalty prescribed in the following section shall apply to only such lands as are or may be hereafter fenced, and provided further that nothing herein shall prevent the necessary use of said Carleton Pond by the Augusta Water District.

Sect. 2. Whosoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more than three hundred dollars and costs for each offense, or imprisonment for sixty days, or both fine and imprisonment. It shall also be unlawful, under the same penalty, for any person to have in his possession at any time any wild bird or wild animal or fish or part thereof taken within the above named closed territory.
