STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Manner of Payments by Towns.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Towns shall pay by check. Chapter five of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding after section sixty-five of said chapter a new section to be numbered sixty-five A, to read as follows:

'Sect. 65A. Officials to pay by check; criminal liability. All cities, towns and plantations shall pay out all moneys expended by them by the issuance of checks. Any officer of any city, town or plantation that issues any check for which there is insufficient funds, or any official responsible for the authorization of such issuance, shall be subject to the provisions and penalties of sections thirteen to fifteen, inclusive, of chapter one hundred thirty-eight.'
