STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Probation Officers for Cumberland County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Section one of chapter three hundred forty-six of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and five, entitled An Act to Provide for the Appointment of a Probation Officer for the County of Cumberland, as amended by chapter twenty-seven of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and fifteen, is further amended by striking out the words "one person as assistant probation officer" in the fourth sentence of said section and inserting in place thereof the words 'two persons as assistant probation officers' so that said sentence, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Said judge of said municipal court shall also appoint two persons as assistant probation officers, to be approved by said judge of said superior court, who shall serve during the pleasure of said judges and shall have the same authority and powers under the direction of said probation officer as said probation officer has under this act.'

Sect. 2. Section three of said chapter three hundred fortysix of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and five, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding to the second sentence of said section the following: 'and the salary of the second assistant probation officer shall be eight hundred eighty-four dollars per year, payable monthly in equal installments by the county treasurer under the same conditions as is provided for the payment of the probation officer,' so that said sentence, as amended, shall read as follows:

'The salary of the assistant probation officer shall be thirteen hundred dollars per year, payable monthly in equal installments by the county treasurer under the same conditions as is provided for the payment of the salary of the probation officer, and the salary of the second assistant probation officer shall be eight hundred eighty-four dollars per year, payable monthly in equal installments by the county treasurer under the same conditions as is provided for the payment of the probation officer.'
