STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Powers of Attorney.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Acts of agent under power of attorney binding upon principal until actual notice of revocation received. All acts of an agent within the scope of his authority under a valid power of attorney shall be binding on his principal, and the heirs and personal representatives of such principal, notwithstanding the death of the principal or the revocation of such power, unless and until actual notice of the death of the principal or revocation of the agent's power has been received by the person, firm, corporation or association so contracting or dealing in good faith with such agent.
